Shade variation

It takes at least eight hides to produce a suite and no two of these can ever be identical. While every effort is made to achieve a uniformity of shade, this is not always possible, for variations in grain structure govern the extent to which dyes and finishes penetrate the various parts of the hide.

However, such variations invariably combine to give an aesthetically pleasing appearance. Because each hide is unique, in bygone times the leather used in furniture was stiff and unyielding but modern tanning process produce leather of glovelike suppleness and this quality endures throughout the lifetime of the furniture.

During the first few weeks of use, wrinkles and creases will form naturally in the leather. This is normal and no cause for concern. This texture is designed into furniture and accounts for the soft inviting appearance which is such a characteristic feature of leather upholstered furniture.

Hide care

Overall Cleaning

For the best results, natural leather should be dusted regularly with a soft cloth and vacuumed once a week to keep the pores free from dust particles and grime. It is advisable to clean the leather periodically using a cloth dampened with a mild solution of tepid water and a pure soaping agent. Care should be taken to ensure that the leather does not become over wet. Polishes, detergents, creams, solvents, vanishes and stain removers, must be avoided as they could damage the leather.

The manufacturers will not accept liability for leather damage or deterioration caused by unsuccessful cleaning. A specialist in leather cleaning should be consulted for professional advice on stain removal.

Heat and sunlight

Do not expose your upholstery to direct sunlight over long periods as this may cause fading. Wherever possible, protect it by drawing curtains or blinds. Ensure your leather is not close to heaters or fireplaces.
